# Income Tax – Subtraction Modification – Public Safety Employee Retirement Income

- FOR the purpose of altering a certain subtraction modification under the Maryland income tax for retirement income attributable to an individual's employment as a public safety employee to include certain retirement income attributable to an individual's employment as a 9-1-1 specialist; and generally relating to a subtraction modification under the Maryland income tax for the retirement income of public safety employees.
